The nationally renowned Lustre craftmaker's market will take place on **Saturday 7th** and **Sunday 8th November** at Lakeside, The University of Nottingham's public arts centre.

Now in its tenth year, Lustre is the largest and most sophisticated event of its kind outside London, attracting over 4,000 visitors in 2008. An expert selection panel chooses around 40 designers to take part from the hundreds who apply.

Also present this year at Lustre will be the well known Yungi range, which includes knitted throws, cushions and scarves, made from 100% pure lambswool giving the products an extremely cosy and soft feel.

Shona Powell, director at Lakeside, said: "Lustre has become a nationally renowned and eagerly anticipated event in the national crafts calendar."

"Over 4,000 people attended last year, and in 2009 we promise another opportunity to discover a wealth of original design from talented makers across the United Kingdom.
